#### Principal's Report 13/06/2025

**Semester One** ends with new electives starting in Week 10 (week beginning 23rd June). This will mean that students will be finishing up assessment tasks and the Year 10s will be beginning to prepare for exams which begin on 16th June (next week). We expect that all students do their best, hand their work in on time and diligently prepare for their exams. If students do not meet due dates they will have a two week window to redeem the work for a score of no more than 50%. Parents will get an email letting them know that their child has not handed in work on time and that they now have the opportunity to do this over a two week period. If they fail to redeem the work it will be classified as a fail for the piece of work. I really encourage students that are attempting to redeem their work or feel like they are falling behind that they make the most of the lunchtime opportunities in The Nest or Study Club each Wednesday and Thursday after school. There is no excuse to not complete work, staff are there to support students and we expect that they do their best.

Our boys team put in a massive effort, overall being undefeated throughout the day which resulted in them coming first.


The girls made it all the way to the Grand Final and had a fantastic 2 point win, placing them first overall as well!


